April 24, 1837.

WHEREAS it has been represented to the Lord Lieutenant, that on the 21st instant, between the Hours of Eleven and Twelve o'Clock, Noon, a Party of Six Men, one of whom was a sandy haired young Man, dressed in a grey frieze coat, hat, and trowsers, supposed

to be the Son of one Martin, of Faughey, went to the House of Thomas Donellan, of Clonflower, Parish and Barony of Rathclin, and County of Longford, attacked and beat him in a most cruel Manner, stabbing him with a Cane Sword:
